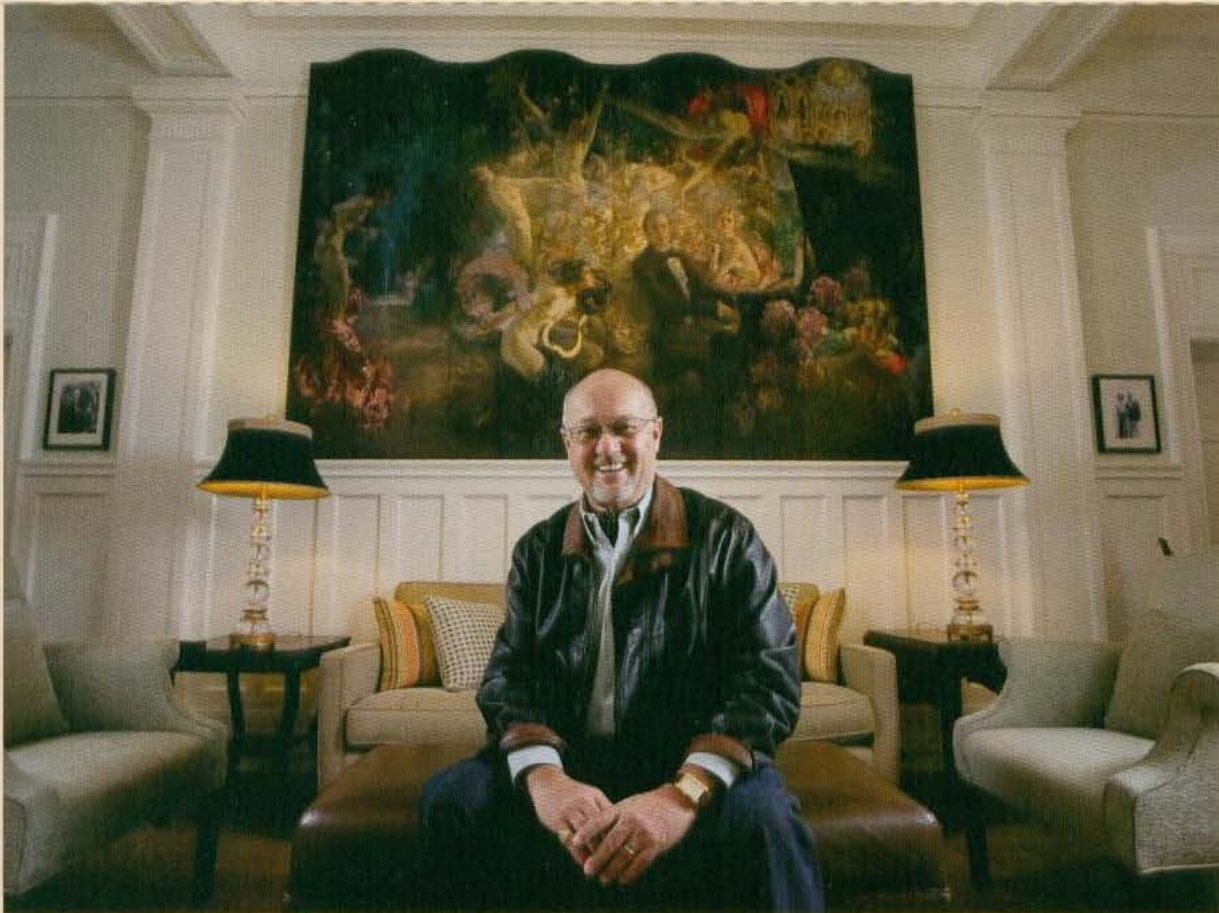

Peter de Savary recalls his first moments on Grenada

I FIRST VISITED GRENADA as a nine-year-old boy in 1953 on a family holiday for six weeks. During the intervening 47 years the lovely aroma of nutmeg from the plantation I visited, swimming on the beautiful Grand Anse Beach and the vibrancy of the capital St George's have always had a pleasing and vivid impression on my memory.

Returning to Grenada in 2006 I was delighted to find the country unchanged in its natural beauty and the charm and friendliness of its people. 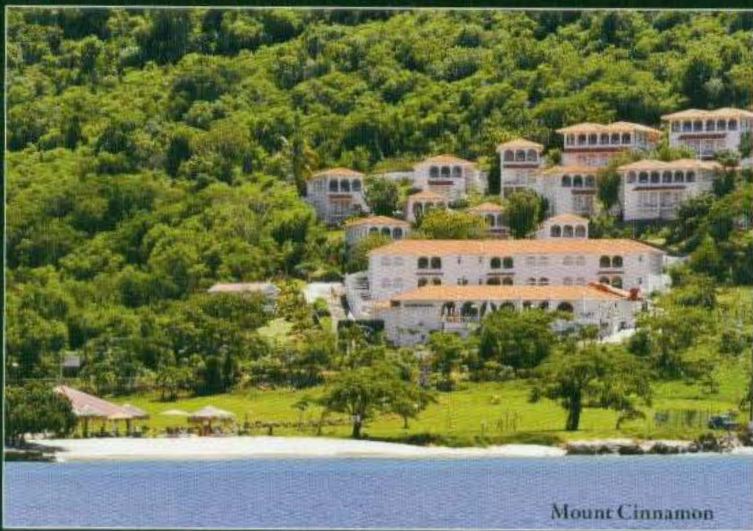

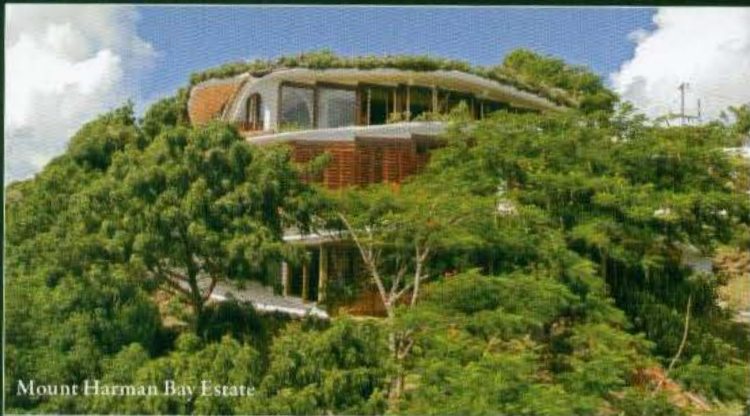

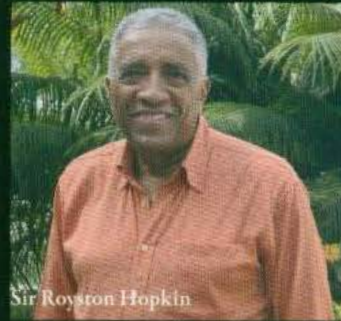

TRUE BLUE BAY RESORT VILLAS & MARINA

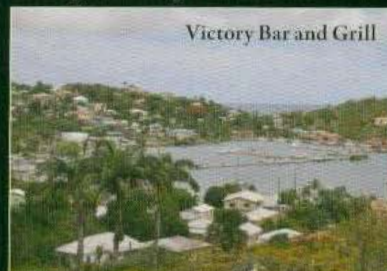
